Where is Anxi County located?

Anxi County (安溪县) (simplified Chinese: 安溪; traditional Chinese: 安溪; pinyin: Ānxī Xiān; Peh-oe-ji: An-khoe koan) is a county of the prefecture-level city of Quanzhou, in southern Fujian province, People's Republic of China with 1,003,599 inhabitants (2020 census). It lies adjacent to and directly north of Xiamen city.

What to do in Anxi?

Trying picking tea leaves is one of the top things to do in Anxi. It is also a "national-level garden county" with rich tourism resources, including Qingshui Yan, Confucius Temple, Fengshan Forest Park and Putuo Temple. You may need 3-4 days for Anxi travelling.

What is Anxi tea?

(Note that Anxi is not to be confused with Anji which is close to Shanghai and famous for its beautiful natural landscapes, pristine bamboo forests, and Anji white tea.)
